

## District of Columbia Felony Probation Revocations

In 2015, 15.2% of all sentences imposed in the District were probation revocations. Offenders in the District may be sentenced to probation as all or part of their sentence. If the terms of probation are violated, probation may be revoked, in which case the individual will be resentenced. Violations of probation may include behavior such as failure to meet with a probation officer, failure to pass a drug test, being arrested on an unrelated charge, or other conditions as determined by the judge and/or probation officer.



The number of probation revocations per year has decreased steadily, from 641 in 2010 to 363 in 2015.



The percentage of sentences imposed for felony probation revocations decreased from 2010 through 2014, but in 2015 increased to the previous 2010 level.



Robbery has been the most common offense of conviction for which a term of probation was revoked every year since 2012, with the exception of 2011<sup>1</sup>. Probation sentences for Possession with Intent to Distribute drugs offenses experienced the highest number of revocations in 2011.
