


In 2015 the four most frequently sentenced felony offenses within the District of Columbia included: attempted robbery, unlawful possession of a firearm, robbery, and possession with intent to distribute (PWID). The most frequently sentenced offense, attempted robbery, accounted for 7.7% of all offenses sentenced in the District in 2015. Combined, these four offenses made up almost a quarter (23.7%) of all felony sentences imposed in the District in 2015.
