

Assault With a Dangerous Weapon (ADW)



"Dangerous Weapon" refers to any object that is used or threatened to be used in a way that is likely to produce serious bodily injury


### **Convicted Cases Breakdown**



- Misdemeanor Convictions Only
- Felony Conviction(s)

Of the 358 cases that resulted in a finding of guilt, 38% (135 cases) were convicted and sentenced for misdemeanor offenses, only

#### **Most Serious Convicted Offense**




\*\*25 of the 223 felony convicted cases are excluded from this analysis as they are pending sentencing

ADW (OSG M6) was the most serious sentenced offense in 36% (72 cases) of the cases containing at least one felony conviction

Attempted ADW (OSG M8) was the most common convicted offense (42%, 42 cases) for the cases where the most serious count was less severe than ADW


### **Arrest Trends**

- Between 2021 and 2022, there were a total of 1,299 ADW adult felony arrests made in the District of Columbia
- There was a 20% decrease in ADW arrests made in 2022 compared to 2021



# **Papering Trends**

- 62% of all adult ADW arrests made in this timeframe were papered (sent to court for prosecution)
- The papering rate of adult ADW arrests did not change from 2021 to 2022



## **Disposition of Filed Cases**

- The 805 papered arrests resulted in a total of 834 nonfugitive cases filed in D.C. Superior Court
  - > 358 Guilty (for any criminal offense)
  - > 238 Closed Without Conviction
  - 238 Pending
