

Robbery Definition:

The deliberate action of taking property unlawfully from a person by means of force or threat of force


Robbery Arrest Conviction Breakdown



- Misdemeanor Convictions Only
- Felony Conviction(s)

Of the 212 cases with a conviction, 28% (59 cases) resulted in a conviction for a misdemeanor offense

Robbery Arrest Convictions: Most Serious Convicted Offense




**6 of the 153 felony convicted cases are excluded from this analysis as they are pending sentencing

Robbery (OSG M6) was the most serious sentenced offense of conviction in 24% (36 cases) of the cases containing at least one felony conviction

Attempted Robbery (OSG M8) was the most common convicted offense (76%, 65 cases) for the cases where the most serious count was less severe than Robbery


Arrest Trends

- Between 2021 and 2022, there were a total of 448 adult Robbery arrests made in the District of Columbia
- There was a 31% decrease in adult Robbery arrests made in 2022 compared to 2021



Papering Trends

- 72% (n=315) of all adult Robbery arrests made in this timeframe were papered (the arrest resulted in a prosecuted D.C. Superior Court case)
- The papering rate of adult Robbery arrests increased by 4% from 2021 to 2022



Disposition of Filed Cases

- The 315 papered adult robbery arrests resulted in a total of 337 non-fugitive cases filed in D.C. Superior Court. Those cases resulted in:
 - > 212 cases with a conviction (for any criminal offense)
 - > 86 cases closed without conviction
 - > 39 remain pending
