
## **Frequently Asked Question**

- Q) Can you help me figure out a defendant? release date?
- A) The Commission does not have access to U.S. Bureau of Prisons or D.C. Department of Corrections release date calculations
- Q) I'm not sure how to determine if a prior out-of-District conviction would impact a defendant's criminal history score, who can I contact for help?
- A) Commission staff are available every business day to provide general and specific information about the substance and application of the Guidelines, as well as how to calculate out-of-District offenses.
- Q) Can the Commission help me determine if these offenses are considered part of the same event?
- A) Whether offensesare part of the same event is a factual determination ultimately made by the Sentencing Judge. The Sentencing Commission does not opine on factual determinations.
- Q) The sentencing judge did not follow the Voluntary Sentencing Guidelines, can I appeal?
- A) An otherwise lawful sentence may not be appealed on the theory that the court misapplied the Guidelines.
- Q) I was hoping to receive a training about the Sentencing Guidelines, how do I go about setting that up for my organization?
